1. Moral Intimacy

(shared sense of what is right)

2. Emotional Intimacy

(being tuned to each other's wavelength)

3. Intellectual Intimacy

(closeness in the world of ideas)

4. Aesthetic Intimacy

(sharing experiences of beauty)

5. Creative Intimacy

(sharing in acts of creating together)

6. Recreational Intimacy

(relating experiences of fun and play)

7. Work Intimacy

(the closeness of sharing common tasks)

8. Crisis Intimacy

(closeness in coping with problems and pain)

9. Conflict Intimacy

(facing and struggling with differences)

10. COMMITMENT INTIMACY

(mutuality derived from common investment)

11. Spirituality Intimacy

(the we-ness in sharing ultimate concerns)

12. Communication Intimacy

(the source of all types of true intimacy)

13. GENITAL INTIMACY

(erotic or orgasmic closeness)
